PREREQUISITES

OBJECTIVE	
Fluency in reading Ancient Greek; assimilation of the final elements of the language morphology (Optative, Perfect, Periphrastic tenses); ability to understand directly, without translation, more Koine Greek texts (most texts of the Septuagint); development of thematic vocabulary; and active assimilation of 2,500 words.

MODE OF ASSESSMENT	
Three quizzes during the semester (60%) and final exam on the texts studied during the semester (40%). The students will prepare two books out of the following list during the semester (or equivalent with the consent of the instructor): -Gospel of John -Gospel of Mark -Book of Tobias -Book of Jonah -Book of Esther The final exam will consist of a Greek paraphrase of a given passage selected by the instructor within the books studied by the student.
