PREREQUISITES	
Completion of Latin III	
OBJECTIVE	
Intermediate Classical Latin. This course, in combination with Latin III, will extend the student's understanding of Latin morphology (case system, verb system, and vocabulary) with the goal of being able to hold a conversation, write a simple text, and to read and understand intermediate in Latin without translating.	
METHODOLOGY

MODE OF ASSESSMENT	
The instructors will assess and grade their students within the framework of the Latin Department's examination standards. There will be more than two formal examinations. The assessment will consider written and oral skill sets.	
PROGRAM	
All five nominal declensions, including subsets (i-stems, etc.). Advanced usage of the 7 cases (nominative, genitive, dative, accusative, ablative, vocative, locative). Advanced usage of adjectives (including comparative, superlative, etc.). Complete system of verbs: indicative, subjunctive, imperative, participle and infinitive for all applicable tenses. Pronouns (ille, ipse, idem, quiddam, etc.). Intermediate syntax: final clauses, oratio obliqua, conditionals, etc.
