METHODOLOGY	
Full immersion, Ulpan method.	
MODE OF ASSESSMENT	
final exam (50%); quizzes throughout the course (25%); homework (10%); presentation in class (5%, optional*); oral exam (10%, optional*); * in case this component is not included in the course, its relative weight will be added to that of the final exam. **The passing threshold for this level is 70/100.	
PROGRAM	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Vocabulary and topics for discussions in class: art, traveling, studying at the university, religion, Israel, etc. ● Habitual action (הייתי שותה קפה כל בוקר) ● Conjugations of prepositions (על, אצל, בגלל, מ, בשביל) 	

- Future tense, various groups of verbs (יקום, ישמור, יראה, יסדר)
- Nominal sentences in the future tense (יהיה לי בית בירושלים)
- Impersonal infinitive constructions in the past and future (היה כדאי, יהיה כדאי)
- Relative clauses (זה הבחור שלימדתי)
- Conditional clauses (real) (אם יהיה לי כסף, אסע לחו"ל)
- Temporal clauses (ש...כש, בזמן ש, אחרי ש, לפני ש)
- Subjunctive mode (אני מבקש שתהיו בשקט)
